Home Renovation Planning Checklist

- 6. Source Materials:** Choose materials early to avoid delays and account for delivery times
- 7. Prepare for Disruption:** Plan how you'll manage day-to-day life during the renovation (temporary kitchen, safety, etc.)
- 8. Future Proof:** Think about long-term value and sustainability (energy efficiency, resale potential)
- 9. Secure Financing (if needed):** Look into home equity loans or lines of credit if necessary
- 10. Document Everything:** Keep all receipts, warranties, and contracts for future reference or resale
